Links between Design Opportunities and Procurement Methods – a Tale of Two Hospital Projects

The Campbelltown Hospital Redevelopment, Sydney completed in 2024 was delivered in two stages, with a total investment of \$766 million under a traditional procurement model. The New \$1.5b Footscray Hospital in Melbourne is due for completion in 2025 and is being delivered under a PPP model. Architects Billard Leece Partnership will provide an overview of these projects including commentary on the alternative delivery models.
